### **Australia's Favourite Ship**

Since arriving in Sydney in November 2004, Pacific Sun has welcomed thousands of Australians onboard and given them all wonderful holidays to remember.

Wowed by Pacific Sun's exciting features such as a two-storey waterslide and a host of entertainment options, passengers have been keen to book exotic cruises to the South Pacific and tropical north Queensland.

At 47,000 tons, Pacific Sun is the biggest ocean liner based in Australia and carries 1900 passengers.

### **Cruising Program**

Pacific Sun debuted in Australia in November 2004, when she began year-round cruises from Sydney to the South Pacific and tropical north Queensland.

During 2007, Pacific Sun will offer 32 sailings, with itineraries varying from a six-night Melbourne Cup cruise to a 13-night voyage to New Caledonia, Fiji and Vanuatu. Destinations include some of the Pacific's most beautiful and remote islands such as Ouvea, Champagne Bay and Isle of Pines, as well as bustling capitals like Noumea and Vila.

In November 2007, Pacific Sun will relocate to Brisbane to become the largest year-round liner ever based in Queensland.

- The meals are served to passengers by 96 waiters and the 13,000 plates, 10,000 glasses and 15,000 pieces of cutlery are cleaned by 29 dishwashers each day.
